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1. Executive Summary

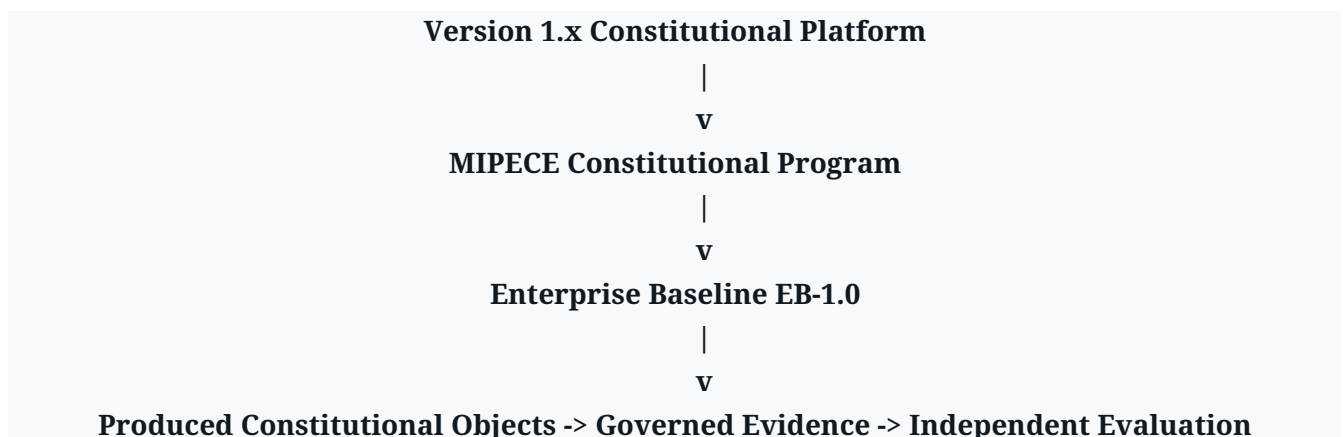
2. Constitutional Position

7.2 MIPECE Volume II - Provable Trust Realization

Governing question: How does MIPECE implement applicable trust requirements and produce independently verifiable trust-relevant artifacts?

- Execution Trust Envelopes and eligibility proofs;
- deployment attestations and release/version binding;
- authority, key, and profile references;
- evidence expectations, completeness proofs, and custody checkpoints;
- independent verification results and replay outcomes;
- bounded trust-property assessments.

7.3 MIPECE Volume III - Proof Assurance Realization

Governing question: How does MIPECE assemble, evaluate, preserve, and optionally present assurance artifacts within its producer jurisdiction?

- proof lineage snapshots and dependency evaluation;
- compatibility evaluations;
- basis assembly acts and immutable assurance bases;
- evaluation executions and Proof Assurance Reports;
- derived eligibility projections;
- presentation artifacts, remediation lineage, and reassessment lineage.

8. Enterprise Baseline Operational Realization

Enterprise Baseline EB-1.0 documents a bounded operational realization of MIPECE's governed execution model. The realization is centered on controlled state transition, explicit authorization, commit-boundary enforcement, immutable evidence generation, and replayable records.

8.1 Operational outcome discipline

- PASS records successful governed completion;

- NOT_APPLICABLE records a bounded determination that the declared execution did not apply;
- TIMED_OUT or supervisory incompleteness records absence of a required runtime declaration without inventing an internal state.

9. Provable Trust Realization

EB-1.0 separates execution eligibility from trust in a completed execution. Eligibility permits initiation under an authenticated, authorized, fresh, context-applicable, and independently attested envelope. Trust in the resulting execution additionally depends on preservation and verification evidence.

10. Proof Assurance Realization

10.1 Readiness and outcome

Assurance Readiness != Assurance Outcome

Failure to constitute a lawful assurance inquiry must be recorded as a readiness or non-evaluation disposition. It must not be laundered into a substantive ELIGIBLE, INELIGIBLE, INDETERMINATE, CONFLICTED, or NON_CONVERGENT outcome.

10.2 Remediation

Legitimate remediation produces new governed objects: a remediation act, corrected proof objects, a new basis assembly act, a new Assurance Basis identity, a new evaluation execution, and a new report. The original defective basis and report remain historically preserved.

11. Evidence and Integrity

The evidence architecture separates evidence integrity, completeness, and availability. A hash or sequence chain protects recorded content but does not prove that every required event was generated, captured, and preserved.
